A brief history

Beginning in 1922, in the WAAFL is now in its 90th year of operation. With 63 clubs, 235 teams and over 15,500 registered players, the WAAFL has grown from a six team competition to the largest single organised football league in WA, catering for players from the age of 16 years, as well as considerable volunteer personnel and social supporters.

The WAAFL provides a quality high standard competition for those players not wishing to endure the commitment to WAFL (second tier competition) training due to study or career commitments or simply a lifestyle that considers football a recreational pursuit, however is in a position to bridge the gap between amateur football and the champions of tomorrow.

Many well known WAFL and AFL personnel began their careers in the WAAFL. Former West Coast Eagles and Hawthorn coach Ken Judge began his coaching career at an A Grade amateur club. Former

Dockers coach Gerard Neesham played several seasons of amateur football and played at state amateur level.

Other high profile players include Drew Banfield, Phil Scott, Troy Wilson (West Coast Eagles), Gary Buckenara (Hawthorn), Shane Parker (Fremantle), Simon Beasley (Western Bulldogs), Sandover Medalists Ian Dargie (2), Alistair Pickett (2) and Shane Beros.

Former Amateur players who have gone on to be senior administrators include current WA Football Commission Chairman Dr Neale Fong (a triple A Grade Fairest & Best medalist with the WAAFL), former Chairman of the WA Football Commission Dr Peter Tannock, current Chairman of Sydney Swans Richard Colless and former West Coast Chairman and AFL Commissioner Terry O'Connor are just a few who have gone on to contribute to Football at a higher level.

THE WA Amateur Football League inducted four new members into its Hall of Champions this year in an event held before more than 200 people at Patersons Stadium in May.

Now in its second year, the Hall of Champions concept honours great contributors to the WAAFL, as well as those who began their careers at an amateur level before going on to contribute at higher tiers.

This year's inductees included Simon Beasley, Gary Buckenara, Rob Hendrie, Terry O'Connor, Bill James, Colin Jamieson, George Meiers and Billy Orr.

Guests were treated to stories from some of the game's greatest servants, from the AFL recruiting coupes of Simon Beasley and Gary Buckenara to WAAFL camaraderie and prank pulling; the inductees all spoke of their foundation in amateur football.

Guest speaker for the night was two-time Premiership player and 1984 Norm Smith Medalists Bill Duckworth, now a 10 time Premiership coach of the North Beach Amateur Football Club and talisman of the WAAFL.

During the evening guests and inductees were able to view a display of some of the most valued awards in Australian Football, including the Brownlow Medal, Margarey Medal, Sandover Medal, William Leitch Medal, North Smith Medal, Coleman Medal, Bernie Naylor Medal and the C.J Jamieson Medal – Awarded to the A Grade WAAFL best and fairest.

It was the first time in the history of Australian football that awarded best and fairest medals from the three major mainland football competitions had been on display together.

West Coast Eagles under 23 state amateur team



THE West Coast Eagles State Amateur U/23's finished in second place at this year's 2011 AAFC National Carnival held in Adelaide in June.

The carnival format meant that each of the competing teams – Victoria, South Australia, Tasmania and WA – played each other once in a modified length game with the two top ranked sides at the conclusion of matches playing in the Grand Final.

After coming from behind with only seconds remaining to clinch victory against Tasmania in game one, the West Coast Eagles State Amateur U/23's accounted for host side South Australia by 21 points in game two of the first day.

The wins against Tasmania and South Australia, the West Coast Eagles State Amateur U/23's only needed Victoria to defeat Tasmania in the first match of the second day to cement a spot in the Grand Final, and the Big V didn't disappoint.

After splitting results the past two times they played, WA claiming a memorable one point Victory in their last game at Fremantle Oval in 2009, the West Coast Eagles State Amateur U/23's were confident of causing an upset in the Grand Final.

Unfortunately it wasn't to be, and Victoria won the match and 2011 AAFC Championship by 70 points.

Six players from the West Coast Eagles State Amateur U/23's squad made the 2011 AAFC All Australian Team at the conclusion of the carnival: Josh Stott (North Beach), Cale Potts (North Beach), Joe Boys (North Beach), Curtis Jack (Kalamunda), Michael McCann (North Fremantle) and Cameron Manuel (Swan Athletic) all earning selection in the team.

The selection of six players was the second highest representation from any state, behind Victoria who had seven and ahead of South Australia (five) and Tasmania (four).





WAAFL Integrated Football

Integrated Football, an initiative of the WAAFL, driven by board member Peter Grosser, completed its first year of fully structured competition in 2011, with Fremantle C.B.C winning the inaugural Grand Final.

Now in its third year, the Integrated Football program gives the opportunity for footballers aged 16 years and older with an intellectual disability to play in a structured competition. In 2011 the competition was made up of five clubs, Warnbro, Kingsway, Fremantle CBC, Lynwood Ferndale and High Wycombe, who played each other once throughout the season.

General Manager of Senior Metropolitan Community Football Cameron Agnew congratulated the clubs on making the program such a success.

“The first WAAFL Integrated Football season was a tremendous success. It was a reflection of the dedicated work done by so many volunteers at the WAAFL clubs to make this program happen.” He said

“The fact that the program has grown from an idea into a viable competition within three years demonstrates the strong capabilities of WAAFL clubs and the opportunity to enter this market and provide AFL to these players.”

“Accolades must be extended to the five clubs involved this year: Fremantle CBC, Lynwood Ferndale, Warnbro Swans, Kingsway and High Wycombe in the manner for which they have embraced the concept and given these players a chance to participate in community football.”

The Grand Final took place on the 28th August at Morris Buzacott Reserve in front of more than 300 people.

Lynwood Ferndale attacked constantly throughout the day but C.B.C managed to stave off the attacks to run out 7.9 (51) to 5.5 (31) winners.

Fremantle C.B.C’s Nicholas Rogerson was awarded the medal for best on ground.

1000 games for Des

THE West Australian umpiring community celebrated a rare milestone this year when goal umpire Des Morgan took to the field for the 1000th time to umpire the A Grade clash between Mount Lawley and Maddington.

Morgan, who began his career in 1978 for the South Suburban Murray National Football League, handpicked the game he officiated for the 1000th time for sentimental reasons.

“My first game was Kalamunda vs Maddington in 1978” said Morgan

“I wanted a Maddington home game originally but it didn’t work out ... since the umpires train at Mount Lawley, I thought that (match) would be a good choice”

Morgan began his umpiring career in the South Suburban Murray National Football League, officiating there until 1985 when it was renamed the Sunday Football League. He umpired for the entire existence of the SFL before joining the WA Amateur Football League in 2009 when the two leagues were amalgamated.

In total, Morgan has umpired in excess of 20 Grand Finals for the South Suburban Murray National Football League, Sunday Football League and WA Amateur Football League.

While it’s an umpires’ job to enforce the rules, Morgan recalls the line was sometimes a little blurred during his playing career.

“I used to be a tough player... I played for three years but I started to get too rough. I think the Sunday Football League Gazette headline was ‘Dirty Player Turns to Umpiring’” He said

Though Morgan insists the headline was more a result of poetic license than his playing style.

“I wasn’t dirty. I was tough, but always fair”

Having now umpired for over thirty years Morgan could be excused from regular training, but still attends every Monday night to assist younger umpires coming through the ranks as Senior Community Umpiring Coordinator.

On top of his role as Umpire Coordinator Morgan continues to umpire multiple matches each weekend, taking on duties in not only the WA Amateur Football League but the WA Women’s Football League.

“I do two women’s matches a weekend as well as amateur games” He said

“The other week I did five games... one Friday night, two Saturday and two on Sunday”

Umpire of the year three times, Umpires Association Life Member 1992, Umpires Association Hall of Fame Inductee 1996 and two-time Department of Sport and Recreation Certificate of Commendation award winner – Des Morgan is one of the most decorated in a profession which often goes without recognition.



Dianella player set to take on the world

The 2011 AFL International Cup had a distinct WA Amateur Football League feel this year, with Dianella Morley midfielder Paul Barry being selected to represent Great Britain.

Originally from England, Paul began playing in the local London league after converting from soccer in 2008.

“My wife’s from Perth and when we came for visits and I would watch the games. I got into it and basically decided to better understand the game I should have a go and play” He said

“The London League is pretty strong, there are six clubs with three teams each and a few expats that played at high levels like WAFL and VFL”

“You definitely learn a lot from them”

The 37 year old Brit moved to Perth permanently in 2010 and joined the Dianella Morley Amateur Football Club, his selection in the Great Britain squad for the International Cup delighting Club President Chris Chadd.

“This is a first for our club; we’re extremely proud and wish Paul all the best.” He said.

“It’s not only great for the game, it’s also great for us as it acknowledges how diverse, welcoming and multi-cultural we are.”

The AFL International Cup took place across Sydney and Melbourne and last 16 days, with the Grand Final being held at the MCG as a curtain raiser to the Hawthorn v Western Bulldogs clash on August 27.

In the lead up to the competition beginning Paul had his sight firmly set on Great Britain’s first task, getting through the first round of matches against arch rivals, Ireland and the International Cup newcomers East Timor.

“With their Gaelic background Ireland play with unbelievable skills and turn of speed,” he said.

“Last time we played them we kicked six goals to nil by quarter time and they still came back to beat us with the last kick of the game”

“Each team plays with their own style ... I’ve never seen East Timor play so I don’t know what to expect”

General Manager of Senior Metropolitan Community Football Cameron Agnew added his congratulations for Paul, saying that it highlights the pathways available from amateur football.

“To represent your country at the highest level in any sport is a great honor, the WA Amateur Football League is extremely proud of Paul,” Mr. Agnew said.

“His selection shows the possible pathways from amateur football, whether it’s playing or coaching.”

Paul was determined not to let the occasion get to his head, instead just thankful he has the opportunity at this stage of his career.

“To get a chance to represent my country, especially at age 37 is not something many people get to do in any sport. I consider myself lucky and I’m gonna do the best I can” He said



One life

IN a sport where players are known for their courage, the story of North Fremantle's Joshua Cunliffe is perhaps one of the most courageous of all. Joshua was only a teenager when he was diagnosed with depression, battling with anxiety, anger, sadness and isolation for years before he sought help to conquer his demons, and now the teenager wants his experiences to help those in a similar place.

At 13 years old Joshua's Grandfather tragically took his own life, the traumatic experience rocked his world and sent Joshua spiralling towards what he now knows was depression. For years he harboured a secret that was eating him inside, and it wasn't until he was 15 years old that he opened up about what he was feeling.

"I had a fight with my parents one night and my best mate took me in. I spoke to him about it and then the next morning when my parents came to pick me up I confessed to them what I was going through" Joshua recalled.

That morning was the first and most important step on a long road to recovery. After years of suffering, Joshua shared the burden and realized that depression was not something he needs to battle alone, that he had a support network of family and friends by his side.

"I was scared and anxious about how they would react, how others would react. There was really no need for that," he said "I wouldn't be here without the support of friends and family and it's really important people who are suffering have that support"

One of those support networks is the North Fremantle Amateur Football Club, a club Joshua has come to call his family.

"North Fremantle have been really impressive," he said "there are always a ton of older guys around that are happy to go out of their way to help you if they can"

The club has proven to be a valuable support network for all their young players, not just Joshua, putting together a group of contacts for Colts players to call to talk to about football or life in general. Joshua believes the support provided from the club is a big help for anybody dealing with mental issues, whatever they may be.

"A football club, especially new clubs can be a very difficult place to integrate, to be yourself. Don't be afraid to be yourself and don't be afraid to ask for help" the Lifeline WA Ambassador said.

Still only 19 years old, Joshua is a young leader at not only the North Fremantle, but in the wider community as well. He has written a book about his battle with depression, wanting to share his experiences with teenagers and young adults who are in a similar position.

"The book came about as I had a friend going through something similar and I wanted to share my experiences with others," he said "I just want to help people in my situation and I'm happy to do anything to help as I understand how hard a place it can be."

This weekend the WA Amateur Football League will be hosting a "One Life" round: an initiative to encourage people like Joshua to come forward and seek help for their illness. Each club will receive promotional material and a special "One Life" branded football, in hope of encouraging any player who is suffering mental health problems to seek help.

General Manager of Senior Metropolitan Community Football Cameron Agnew believes that the One Life program will have significant community benefit.

"Amateur football shares many similar philosophies with the addressing mental health, that being teamwork, communication and resilience." Mr Agnew said

"The community football clubs are an ideal environment to talk about men's mental health. Looking out for your teammates, helping them get back up, are all part of being a strong footballer and being responsible for your own mental health.
